

Animal Licensing

An animal wearing a license is the best way to quickly identify and reunite you with your animal should he/she become lost.

Some of the benefits of having a pet license has benefits for you, the pet owner

- A license is the best way to reunite you with your dog if he/she becomes lost.
- A pet wearing a license tag can quickly be identified and returned to you.
- If your pet is found by one of our officers seriously injured and you could not be immediately contacted, the license would guarantee that he/she would be taken to a veterinarian for emergency care. This can mean the difference between life and death for a badly injured animal, which unfortunately we receive almost daily at the shelter.

Springville City requires the following for animal licensing:

- Pet owners must license by the time the pet is three months of age or **within 30 days** of moving into an area or acquiring the pet.
- Animal licenses shall be effective from the date of issuance through the expiration date of the Rabies certificate, but not to exceed three years.
- All dogs and cats are required to have a current Rabies vaccination.
- All dogs are required to wear their Rabies and South County license tags at all times.
- Each residence may have two dogs and two cats (Springville City Code 3-7-304)
- Cats may be licensed for their protection, but a license for a cat is not required.

Altered Animals

(spayed or neutered)

One year	\$15
Two years	\$25
Three years	\$35

Unaltered Animals

(not spayed or neutered)

One year	\$35
Two years	\$65
Three years	\$95
