LANDMARKS PRESERVATION COMMISSION

The Landmarks Preservation Commission is found in §5-06 of the City Code. It was established to preserve the historical heritage of the City and to identify, preserve, protect and enhance historic and prehistoric areas lying within the City. The Commission consists of five to nine members appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. Members serve terms of four years and are chosen from individuals with a demonstrated interest, competence, or knowledge in historic preservation. When such individuals are available, two members shall be professionals, as defined by National Park Service regulations, from the disciplines of history, architecture or architectural history.

LIBRARY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Library Board of Directors was established by §4-06 of the City Code in 1968. The Board of Directors consists of a Librarian who is the executive officer of the Board, the Mayor or a member of the Council appointed by the Mayor, and four to eight City residents appointed by the Mayor with approval by the City Council. This Board is charged with the condition and operation of the Library and may make such rules and regulations to govern its orderly operation. Members serve terms of three years from the first day of April and the term of the Mayor or Council representative corresponds to their tenure in office.

AD HOC LIBRARY BUILDING COMMITTEE

The Ad Hoc Library Advisory Committee consists of two City Council Members, two Library Trustees, the Library Director, and four community members. Community members include both adult and adolescent representation. Space limitations for collections and programming, and the age and condition of our current facility necessitate that the library look toward building a new facility. It is our desire to cultivate input from the library staff and the community as to what they would like to see in a new library. The following items will be addressed:

1. Review the current building, mission of library, desired image, and purpose of new facility. Provide list of new facilities to visit with a checklist of items to consider. Presentation from architect
2. Power point presentation of new buildings including advancing in technology that benefit both community and staff and invite savings, and trends in use, services and function. Goal is to define and prioritize desired elements in new facility. Presentation by library consultant.
3. Develop a communications strategy. Formulate goals, *measurable* objects, budget and timetable. Assign tasks. Focus on asking core markets what they want. Communication through public relations, advertising, and community relations. Develop a message. Select communication methods/materials targeted to specific market segments. Develop tools such as a basic fact sheet for the library, press kit, talking points, etc.

PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD

The Parks and Recreation Board was created by §5-01 of the City Code. It consists of between five and nine members as follows: (1) two members of the City Council designated by the Mayor (one as member and one as alternate member); and (2) three to seven members appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the City Council. Members serve terms of four years so that one member term expires each year. City Council members' term is concurrent with their term of office also in two year segments. The term of office commences on April 1. Duties of the Parks and Recreation Board are to recommend park development plans for both City and Canyon Parks to the City Council, recommend recreation programs to the City Council, and perform other duties deemed appropriate and assigned by the Mayor. This committee was authorized to form subcommittees to oversee specific areas of concern to the Board.

The Power Advisory Board is established by City Code §5-10 and consists of seven to eleven members as follows: (1) two members of the City Council as designated by the Mayor, one as a nonvoting member and one alternate; and (2) five to nine members appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the City Council. Each member serves a term of four years from April 1, except Council members, who serve terms of two years concurrent with their term. Duties of the Power Advisory Board include (1) advising the City Council on long range planning and policy matters related to the power system and acquisition and development of power resources; (2) advising and making recommendations to the City Council concerning power rates; and (3) performing any other duties deemed appropriate and assigned by the Mayor.

SPRINGVILLE ARTS COMMISSION

The Springville Arts Commission was established by City Code §5-7 to promote and encourage public programs, to further the development and public awareness of and interest in the fine and performing arts and to act in an advisory capacity to the City Council in connection with the artistic and cultural development of the City. The Commission shall consist of not less than five nor more than fifteen members to be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. Each member shall serve a term of four years. The Commission has the following duties and powers: (1) to recommend expenditures in accordance with the annual budget adopted by the City Council and to annually review the financial needs of public programs for development of the fine and performing arts and to prepare and submit a proposed budget to the Mayor therefore; (2) to recommend public programs to further the development and public awareness of and interest in the fine and performing arts; (5) to encourage donations and grants to the city and to arts organizations in the City and to advise the City Council regarding the receipt and expenditure of such funds; (6) to evaluate and make recommendations for the use of city, county, state, and federal arts grants which may be obtained by the City; and, (7) to advise and assist the City Council and Mayor in connection with such other artistic activities as may be referred to it by them.
